Teacher/Staff Copyright Information

- **\Delta** Why is this information important?
 - You can be held liable.
 - Penalties: If the law is broken by lawful intent, penalties can be up to \$250,000 per infringement and /or 1-5 years in jail.
 - Schools/Libraries fall under "Fair Use" interpretation which offers some protection, but does not prevent possible civil suit.

Print Materials

- ❖ What print materials can I copy for teacher/classroom use?
 - Single copies only:
 - Chapter of a book
 - Article from a magazine or newspaper
 - A short story, short essay, or short poem
 - A chart, diagram, cartoon, or picture from a book, magazine, or newspaper
 - O Multiple copies:
 - A complete poem if less than 250 words, an excerpt from a longer poem not to exceed 250 words.
 - A complete article, story, or essay of less than 2500 words, or an excerpt from a larger article, story or essay not to exceed 2500 words or 10% of the whole.
 - One chart, graph, diagram, cartoon, or picture per book or magazine issue.
- What are the limits to my coping?
 - Copying is made for one course only, and the same item is not reproduced year after year.
 - One work from a single author.
 - O No charge is made to student beyond actual copy cost.
 - O Copying does not replace or substitute textbooks.
 - Class copies cannot be made from consumable books or any book that specifically states the prevention of copying.

Videos

❖ What can I show?

- O Purchased and rented videos may be used for direct instruction only and may not be used for entertainment or rewards (Unless public performance license has been obtained).
- Rented videos must be rented by individual person and not the school or it cannot be shown in the classroom due to contract issues.
- Libraries may acquire and loan videos, but any public viewing would require public performance rights (ex Family Movie Night)
- O Programs taped from satellite or cable used for direct instruction only.

❖ What can't I show?

- Copies of purchased videos
- O Anything taped from HBO, Showtime, or any cable channel you pay for.

❖ What can be taped?

- Programs may only be taped from open-air broadcast stations for which no payment is made to receive programs.
- O Taped programs may be kept 45 calendar days after taping, then must be erased.
- O During this 45 day period, the tape may be used with students only during the first 10 consecutive school days.
- O Recordings may only be made at the request of teachers.
- O Programs must be recorded in its entirety (opening authorship to ending credits) and may not be edited.

Software/Internet

❖ What can be copied?

- Basically, NOTHING!
- ❖ What can I load on my computer?
 - Nothing that the school does not have a license for.
 - If you bring and load personal software, you must have a license for it and it then becomes the property of the school. Contact the technology department if you want to load software you have purchased yourself. It must be educational.
