JOINTLY DEVELOPED

The parents, students, and staff of Henderson Middle School partnered together to develop this school-parent compact for achievement. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added input about the types of support they needed, and students told us what would help them learn. Parents are encouraged to attend annual revision meetings held in the spring each year to review the compact and make suggestions based on student needs and school improvement goals. 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To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, you, and your child will work together to:

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Henderson Middle School will:

- Provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards by:
 - Ensuring teachers implement the Georgia Standards of Excellence consistently and effectively in all classrooms.
 - Increasing rigor and quality of instruction in all content areas for all students.
 - Implementing strategies that develop skills in authentic literacy (reading, writing, and speaking).
- The teacher will meet with the parent/family and student, at the beginning of the school year, to identify and target an individual focus area to be addressed by the school-parent compact based on the student's performance on grade level universal screenings. The teacher will provide specific strategies to the family and student designed to target this focus area that can be practiced at home. The teacher/family/student will establish reasonable expected growth targets and a means by which to measure growth.
- Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement.
 - Parent conferences will be held before, during, and after school hours. The school-parent compact will serve as an agreement for teachers and parents to share the responsibility for improved student achievement. Parents will be able to schedule conferences with their child's teachers at other times throughout the year based on the students' needs.
- Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress.
 - Progress reports will be posted every 41/2 weeks for parent review.
 - Weekly grades will also be accessible to parents on Infinite Campus.
- Provide parents reasonable access to staff. In effort to build strong relationships and perceptions, parents are encouraged to contact school personnel with questions, concerns or to schedule a meeting.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Students will:

- Follow Henderson Middle School's expectations.
- Check Infinite Campus to review grades weekly.
- Set academic goals for the year.
- Read daily at home and at school.
- Put forth my best effort in my classes.
- The student will use self-monitoring strategies, with the support of the family and assistance from the teacher, to assess his/her progress on achieving academic achievement goals/learning targets related to content vocabulary development.
- Work towards perfect attendance and come to school with school supplies.
- Ask for help when needed.
- Communicate with parents, teachers or school counselors as needed.
- Believe in themselves and in their learning abilities.
