



First Responders are a great example of humility. Most of the time they are running towards danger while others are running away from it. And in some cases what they "give up" to put others first is their own life.


Take a moment today to thank a first responder for being a picture of humility.

1000 Books Before Kindergarten

The concept is simple, the rewards are priceless. Read a book (any book) to your newborn, infant, and/or toddler. The goal is to have read 1000 books (yes you can repeat books) before your precious one starts kindergarten. Does it sound hard? Not really if you think about it. If you read just one book a night, you will have read abut 365 books in a year. That is 730 books in two years and 1095 books in three years. If you consider that most children start kindergarten at around 5 years of age, you have more time than you think (so get started).

The 1000 Books Before Kindergarten app lets you keep




track of your reading activity quickly and easily.

- Track your progress to 1000 books!


