The cross country teams ran at Lafayette Christian School in Lagrange on Tuesday, September 5.

The boys led off the races and pulled off a tough feat. They finished first place in a field of 15 teams, knocking off defending champion Creekside Christian. Creekside defeated the boys last year so it was a nice to get them back this year.



The boys were led by medalists Derrick Adams (4th), Santiago Reynolds (5th), and TJ White (6th). Freshman Caden Bynum (11th) and Senior Mason VanLandingham (16th) came up big for the team as well as they rounded out the top 5 scoring runners for the team. It was also nice to have the return of senior Javier Reynolds for the first time this season and he had a strong finish at 18th place.

The girls also had a strong race, finishing in 6th place. They were led by junior Isabella Lee and Sophomore Alivia Vaughn. Kiersten Caron had a good race finishing 3rd for the team and Destiny Nicholson came in 4th in her first race of the season. Anslie Atkinson edged out teammate Taylor Wagers for 5th and 6th place on the team.

Next up, the teams will go up against the best in the state as they preview the state championship course in Carrollton this Saturday.



Panda Geologists


Mrs. Kitchens' second grade class rocked on; they are geologists in the making!



1000 Books Before Kindergarten

The concept is simple, the rewards are priceless. Read a book (any book) to your newborn, infant, and/or toddler. The goal is to have read 1000 books (yes you can repeat books) before your precious one starts kindergarten. Does it sound hard? Not really if you think about it. If you read just one book a night, you will have read abut 365 books in a year. That is 730 books in two years and 1095 books in three years. If you consider that most



children start kindergarten at around 5 years of age, you have more time than you think (so get started).

The 1000 Books Before Kindergarten app lets you keep track of your reading activity quickly and easily.




